DAY ONE

06.15	Coach arrives at School.

12.00 E.T.A. Calais. Transfer to Bruges. *Please note: Continental time is 1hr in advance of UK time.*

13.30 Visit to Bruges - 'The Venice of The North'.

Bruges is one of the most beautiful towns in Belgium, with its winding canals, cobbled squares, ancient town hall & historic cathedral. We will walk through the ancient cobbled streets to arrive at the central square, where we will enjoy some free time to explore the town & visit the shops. Afterwards, we will have the opportunity to climb to the top of the cathedral spire for magnificent views over the rooftops below.

20.30 E.T.A. Hotel Meininger, Amsterdam. Check-in & allocate room keys.

21.30 Dinner at Hermes Cafe, Amsterdam.

Students will enjoy a lasagne dinner at this very good bar restaurant which attracts a young crowd of locals. The restaurant is located a short walk from the hotel.

09.00 Coach transfer to The Rijksmuseum.

10.00 Visit to The Rijksmuseum

Participants will view several medieval and Renaissance masterpieces and the best collection of 17th Century Dutch paintings in the world. Pupils will learn about the importance of imagery in detailed studies of several Dutch works by such artists as Steen, Vermeer and Rembrandt. The tour will culminate with a study of 'The Nightwatch' by Rembrandt.

12.15 Lunch in the Leidesplein area of Amsterdam.13.30 Walk to Anne Frank House, Prinsengracht.

14.00 Visit to The Anne Frank House.

The Ann Frank House is sited on the beautiful Prinsengracht Canal & is one of the most popular visits in Amsterdam. The Frank family hid for several years during the 'Dark Years' of the German occupation in a secret annex at the top of the house. After a tip-off from a member of the public, the annex was discovered during a Gestapo raid & the family were sent east to Auschwitz. The only member of the family to survive was Annes's father, who discovered Anne's diary hidden in the annex after the end of the Second World War.

- 15.30 Walk to FOAM Gallery, Kaisergracht.
- 16.00Visit to The 'Foam Museum' The AmsterdamPhotography Museum ('FOAM Fotography Amsterdam')

Foam is a museum for photography which is very suitable for a city like Amsterdam: inspirational, accessible, uncomplicated, yet critical. Foam is more than a museum. Foam is on Keizersgracht, and elsewhere too: in Foam magazine, out on the streets, abroad, on tour.

Foam is constant inspiration, presented at different speeds. Major exhibitions interspersed with small-scale, quickly alternating shows. Foam holds lively discussions about photography, while providing an opportunity for concentration and study. Foam presents a broad selection of images, while recognising the importance of detail. Alongside the big names, the museum is a laboratory for developing unknown talent.

Foam features surprising combinations, because it presents the quality of photography in every form: autonomous, documentary and applied. Historical and contemporary.

Foam collaborates with other organisations and companies. Both to realise the museum's ambitions and because it fits in with Foam's belief in accessibility. Collaboration provides an

opportunity for a broad public to experience the power of photography.

Foam documents and stimulates the development of photography. It gives photographers, image editors, designers and others in the profession a place to meet and find inspiration.

Foam is open and everyone can now enjoy photography.

17.15 Walk to Bierfabriek Restaurant.

17.45 Dinner at Bierfabriek Restaurant, Amsterdam.

Located a short walk from the Floating Flower Market, Bierfabriek is a popular local microbrewery that specialises in roast chicken & chips. Located amongst the large aluminium beer casks are long tables packed with locals tucking into roast chicken & sampling the craft beers. We will enjoy a whole mini-chicken with chips each in a private room within the microbrewery.

19.00 Exploration of the Floating Flower Market region.

The Floating Flower Market is located within a popular shopping area. Students will enjoy exploring the popular area of the Floating Flower Market, the nearby shops & nearby Damm Square with the Royal Palace. The shops remain open until 20.30.

DAY THREE

10.00 Visit to The Van Gogh Museum, Amsterdam.

The collection is arranged chronologically from Van Gogh's early years in Holland to the brighter works he painted after moving to Paris, and later in Arles, where he produced vivid canvasses like 'The Yellow House' and the 'Sunflowers' series. It ends with his more expressionistic works and with his final tortured paintings done at Auvers a few weeks before he shot and fatally wounded himself. The Van Gogh Museum was recently renovated & the works are very well displayed. We will have time to complete some sketches inside the museum as well as visit the extensive shop on the ground floor.

- 13.45 Walk to The Stedilijk Museum.

14.15 Visit to The Stedilijk Museum.

Founded in 1874, the Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam is a museum for classic modern and contemporary art in Amsterdam. The original red brick, Neo-Renaissance style building was designed by architect Adriaan Willem Weissman.

The collection contains some 90,000 objects from a variety of disciplines. Highlights of the collection include The Beanery by Edward Kienholz and works by Kazimir Malevich, Bauhaus and De Stijl. Since 1909, the Stedelijk has been devoted to collecting thought-provoking contemporary art, later augmenting its collection with photography and design objects. In the course of the last century, the Stedelijk Museum became renowned as one of the world's most influential museums for twentieth-century art. The collection rivals that of the Centre Pompidou and MoMA. Since its inception, the Stedelijk Museum has consistently reflected new currents and developments in art and design in both its exhibition and acquisitions policy.

16.15 Walk to The Huis Marseille Photography Museum.

Visit to The Huis Marseille Photography Museum.

(Keizersgracht 401, 1016 EK Amsterdam)

Huis Marseille is Amsterdam's first photography museum. For more than ten years Huis Marseille has offered a varied exhibition program in which photography's rich history and diverse uses are given consideration. In addition to this, the museum also frequently shows work from its own collection of contemporary photography.

Huis Marseille serves as a platform for the particularization of photography. The museum provides a view of the 'landscape' taking shape in photography; it presents photographers, artists and forms of photography which do justice to visual quality and which can be counted among the medium's major, but also lesser known, highlights. This stands in contrast to the profusion of photography as a mass medium

In terms of the installation of exhibitions, the unique structure of this museum plays a significant role. Each of the six exhibition spaces has its own specific character, yet all relate to the work on display. The building still has the atmosphere of a 'gentleman's residence', but its rooms have now become galleries. A sense of warmth and intimacy has remained. Huis Marseille strives to make the visitor feel welcome in these home-like surroundings.

17.45 Walk to Tap & Dine Restaurant.

18.15 Dinner at Tap & Dine Restaurant, Amsterdam.

Our lively restaurant for the final night is located on the Leidesplein, with music icons adorning the walls, seating areas for groups & a live DJ often playing. We will have an enormous burger & chips dinner on a long group table. This will be a fun & memorable final dinner.

DAY FOUR

11.00	<u>E.T.A. Otterlo – Visit to The Kroller Muller Museum.</u>
09.00	Coach transfer to the De Hoge Veluwe National Park at Otterlo.
08.00	Breakfast.

Beautifully situated in this expansive national park, the Kroller Muller Museum is a must for students of modern art. The visit will start with a 15 minute film about the Kroller Mullers, the museum building and the collection itself, which actually includes more Van Goghs than the Van Gogh Museum.

Participants will then be free to visit the permanent collection, which is arranged in a light and airy building with huge windows that offer views of the dense woodland in which the museum is set.

The Sculpture Garden is open throughout the year and, in the warmer months, allows for outside sketching and painting on the lawns. The museum has an excellent cafeteria, as well as an outdoor terrace on which participants may like to have their lunches.

The entrance cost to the museum includes the hire of bicycles and most groups enjoy the chance of cycling on the special paths through the most beautiful countryside.
